President's Message

Greetings everyone. The society continues to grow and the newsletter continues strong. There has not been a great deal of activity to report since our last newsletter. In January the annual meeting of the American Historical Association was held in Chicago while the combined annual meeting of the American Philological Association and the American Institute of Archaeology was held in Philadelphia. There were few papers on ancient military history directly, but on many related topics and it provided an opportunity for many people to catch up with colleagues and recent work in the field.

The next few months will be an active period for ancient military historians. The Classical Association of the Midwest and South (CAMWS) will hold its annual meeting in Baton Rouge March 28-31. The University of Calgary is hosting a two-day conference March 30-31 "War and Society: The social and cultural impact of War from ancient times to the present day." Papers to be presented will be on an array of topics, but most will be about the ancient world. In April the Ancient Borderlands Research Focus Group at UC Santa Barbara will host a graduate conference on "Conflict, Consensus, and the Crossing of Boundaries in the Premodern World." During the first weekend in May the Association of Ancient Historians will hold their annual meeting in Chapel Hill and Durham North Carolina and we hope to see many of you there. Then during the second weekend in May, the Society for Military History annual conference will be held in Arlington Virginia. During that conference there will be four panels on ancient military history, two of which are sponsored by the Society of Ancient Military Historians. It will be a busy spring and we hope to bring reports from several of these conferences.

I also draw your attention to the books we receive for review. We now regularly receive books and we are actively seeking interested experts to review them. If you would like to volunteer to write a review and are familiar with the topic a book we have covers then please let us know you are interested. You can reach me at the address in the newsletter. Similarly, if you are a publisher seeking to gain wide exposure for a review of your book then do not hesitate to send us a copy at the address in the newsletter.

Finally, I observe that this is my last column as president of the SAMH. In May I will step aside and Roth, Jonathan current Vice-President, will take the helm. It has been an immense pleasure to work with Jonathan and Dan to shepherd organization the through its reorganization and see it emerge stronger. I will not be leaving the organization entirely, however, as I will continue on as book review editor for the newsletter.
